The Bureau of Engraving and Printing in Fort Worth, also known as the Western Currency Facility, is one of only two places in the U.S. where paper money is printed. Visitors can take a guided tour to see millions of dollars being produced and learn about the history of U.S. currency. For security reasons, items such as cell phones, backpacks, cameras, video equipment, and weapons are not allowed inside the facility.
