NEW VA FORM DETERMINES NATIONAL CEMETERY ELIGIBILITY

The VA now provide eligibility determinations for interment in a VA National Cemetery prior to the time of need.

Through the Pre-Need Determination of Eligibility Program, upon- request, individuals can learn if they are eligible for burial or memorialization in a "VA National Cemetery."

Interested individuals may submit VA Form 40-10007, the Application for Pre-Need Determination of Eligibility for Burial in a VA National Cemetery and supporting documentation such as a DD-214, to the VA National Cemetery Scheduling Office.

To obtain a copy of the form, visit www.cem.va.gov.

Once the form is completed, it can be submitted to the VA in one of three ways:

NEW VA FORM DETERMINES NATIONAL CEMETERY ELIGIBILITY (cont)

The VA will review applications and provide written notice of eligibility. The VA will save determinations and supporting documentation electronically to expedite burial arrangements at the time of need.

This form does not reserve space in a national cemetery, so even though you might be eligible, space limitations could hinder burial in the future. This new process will help alleviate some of the stress families encounter when trying to find paperwork to verify that a veteran was appropriately discharged so they can be interred in a VA National Cemetery.

Planning ahead and getting paperwork in order is nothing new for VFW. The organization has been a strong supporter of members making funeral arrangements in advance. Many families preplan funeral services to have their loved one's final wishes honored.

The increasing trend toward funeral pre-planning-when people make funeral arrangements in advance-suggests that many consumers want to compare prices and services so that, ultimately, the funeral reflects a wise and well-informed purchasing decision, as well as a meaningful one," advises the Federal Trade Commission."

Pre-Planning might also reduce some of the stress that the family experiences upon a loved one's death. If his or her wishes are known, emotional overspending often is avoided. Plannng ahead enables comparison shopping without time constraints, facilitates family discussion of important final arrangement decisions and removes burden from loved ones.

WHAT WE LEARN ABOUT ASPARAGUS

When I was in the USN I was stationed in Key West, FL. I worked at the clinic at Naval Air Station on Big Coppiutt Key just a few miles north of Key West. The hospital at Key West was for out patient only for retired armed forces personnel that lived in the area and if you needed to be hospitalized you were sent to Homestead AFB Florida. I had the day off and just went inside the hospital (Corpsman barracks next to hospital). There was a retired navy man that worked in the lab and he was very interesting gentleman to talk with. He was a retired biochemist from the USN. He asked me what was going on that day and I said I had the day off.

I wish I was working on the crew today, but was taking a sailor to Homestead as he had a very bad kidney infection. Now this elderly gent told me the man should have eaten more asparagus and he wouldn't have that problem. I asked why? I'll never forget him saying do you eat asparagus and I said yes, I love them. He replied you notice how your urine stinks after eating asparagus? I said well I never thought it was what I ate but yes it does have a pungent odor. It is because it is detoxifying your body of harmful chemicals!!! This was back in 1986 when I was stationed there and to read this email again I had to share this story...Eat more asparagus my friends.

Asparagus -- Who knew? My Mom had been taking the full-stalk canned style asparagus, pureed it and took 4 tablespoons in the morning and 4 tablespoons later in the day. She did this for over a month. She is on chemo pills for Stage 3 lung cancer in the pleural area and her cancer cell count went from 386 down to 125 as of this past week. Her oncologist said she will not need to see him for 3 months.

THE ARTICLE: Several years ago I met a man seeking asparagus for a friend who had cancer. He gave me a copy of an article, entitled "Asparagus For Cancer" printed in the Cancer News Journal, December 1979. I will share it here, just as it was shared with me: I am a biochemist, and have specialized in the relation of diet to health or over 50 years. Several years ago, I learned of the discovery of Richard R. Vensal, D.D.S. that asparagus might cure cancer. Since then, I have worked with him on his project. We have accumulated a number of favorable case histories. Here are a few examples:

Case No. 1, A man with an almost hopeless case of Hodgkin's disease (cancer of the lymph glands) who was completely incapacitated. Within 1 year of starting the asparagus therapy, his doctors were unable to detect any signs of cancer, and he was back on a schedule of strenuous exercise.

Case No. 2, A successful businessman, 68 years old, suffered from cancer of the bladder for 16 years. After years of medical treatments, including radiation without improvement, he began taking asparagus. Within 3 months, examinations revealed that his bladder tumor had disappeared and that his kidneys were normal.

WHAT WE LEARN ABOUT ASPARAGUS (cont)

Case No. 3, On March 5th 1971, a man who had lung cancer was put on the operating table where they found lung cancer so widely spread that it was inoperable. The surgeon sewed him up and declared his case hopeless. On April 5th he heard about the Asparagus therapy and immediately started taking it. By August, x-ray pictures revealed that all signs of the cancer had disappeared. He is now back at his regular business routine.

Case No. 4, A woman had been troubled for a number of years with skin cancer. She developed different skin cancers which were diagnosed by the acting specialist as advanced. Within 3 months after beginning asparagus therapy, the skin specialist said her skin looked fine with no more skin lesions. This woman reported that the asparagus therapy also cured her kidney disease, which had started in 1949. She had over 10 operations for kidney stones, and was receiving government disability payments for an inoperable, terminal, kidney condition. She attributes the cure of this kidney trouble entirely to the asparagus treatment.

I was not surprised at this result as the elements of material medical edited in 1854 by a Professor at the University of Pennsylvania, stated that Asparagus was used as a popular remedy for kidney stones. He even referred to experiments in 1739, on the power of asparagus in dissolving stones. Note the dates! We would have other case histories but the medical establishment has interferred with our obtaining some of the records. I am therefore appealing to readers to spead this good news and help us to gather a large number of case histories that will overwhelm the medical skeptics about this unbelievably simple and natural remedy.

For the treatment, asparagus should be cooked before using. Fresh or canned asparagus can be used. I have corresponded with the two leading canners of asparagus, Giant and Stokely, and I am satisfied that these brands contain no pesticides or preservatives. Place the cooked asparagus in a blender and liquefry to make a puree. Store in the refrigerator. Give the patient 4 full tablespoons twice daily, morning and evening. Patients usually show some improvement in 2-4 weeks. It can be diluted with water and used as a cold or hot drink. This suggested dosage is based on present experience, but certainly larger amounts can do no harm and may be needed in some cases.

As a biochemist I am convinced of the old saying that what cures can prevent. Based on this theory, my wife and I have been using asparagus puree as a beverage with our meals. We take 2 tablespoons dilute in water to suit our taste with breakfast and with dinner. I take my hot and my wife prefers hers cold.

Have you lost military service medals, decorations, or awards that you or a family member earned and need to replace them? Find out how to request for replacements and what forms you will need to fill out.

Medals awarded while in active service will be issued by the appropriate service if requested by veterans or, if deceased, their next of kin.

Medals awarded while in active service are issued by the individual military services if requested by veterans or by the next of kin of deceased veterans. Requests for the issuance or replacement of military service medals, decorations, and awards should be directed to the specific branch of the military in which the veteran served. However, for Air Force (including Army Air Corps) and Army veterans, the National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) verifies the awards to which a veteran is entitled and forwards requests and verification to appropriate service department for issuance.

For the Veteran: in general, the military services will work replacement medal requests for the veteran at no cost. This includes family members with the signed authorization of the veteran.


For the Next-of-Kin: the process (and cost) for replacement medals requests differs among the service branches and is dependent upon who is requesting the medal, particularly if the request involves an archival record.

For the General Public: if the service member separated from military service before 1954, the public may purchase a copy of the veteran's Official Military Personnel File (OMPF) to determine the awards due and obtain the medals from a commercial source. If the service member separated after 1953, the public may request such information from the OMPF via the Freedom of Information Act.

Requesting Replacement Awards and Medals

Requests for the issuance or replacement of military service medals, decorations, and awards should be directed to the specific branch of the military in which the veteran served. However, for Air Force (including Army Air Corps) and Army personnel, the National Personnel Records Center will verify the awards to which a veteran is entitled and forward the request with the verification to the appropriate service department for issuance of the medals.

The <u>eVetRecs</u> is preferred for requesting medals and awards. Provide as much information as possible in the comments field. Should you prefer to submit your request using a <u>SF180</u> then provide as much information as possible and send the form to the appropriate address from the following tables:



WHAT WE LEARN ABOUT ASPARAGUS (cont)

Here are some recent photos of the LCS-2 (to be named the USS Independence). Here she is at sea trials running at only HALF- power at 43 knots! NOTE the absence of a bow wave.

ABOUT THE NAVY'S NEW PIRATE CATCHER (cont)

There have been rumors about the U.S. Navy's speedy new triple hulled ships, But now they're for real. The U.S.S Independence was built by General Dynamics. It's called a "littoral combat ship" (LCS), and the Trimaran can move its weapons around faster than any other ship in the Navy. (Ironic that with all that high tech, the ship reminds me of the Merrimac ironclad from Civil War days).

'Littoral' means Close-to-shore, and that's where these very ships will operate. They're tailor-made for launching helicopters and lightly-armored Vehicles, sweeping mines and firing all manner of torpedoes, missiles and machine guns. These ships are also relatively inexpensive. This one is a bargain at \$208 million, and the Navy plans to build 55 of them.

This tri-maran is the first of a new fire breathing breed, ready to scoot out of dry dock at a rumored 60 knots top speed. It's Like a speedy and heavily armed aircraft carrier for helicopters. Pirates Beware!!!

- 8. The "Things" That You Own.....Many of the very possessions that we used to own are still in our lives, but we may not actually own them in the future. They may simply reside in "the cloud." But all of that is changing. Apple, Microsoft, and Google are all finishing up their latest "cloud services." That means that when you turn on a computer, the Internet will be built into the operating system. So, Windows, Google, and the Mac OS will be tied straight into the Internet. If you click an icon, it will open something in the Internet cloud. If you save something, it will be saved to the cloud. And you may pay a monthly subscription fee to the cloud provider.
