President Tom Morrissey lead in the Pledge of Allegiance. Meeting adjourned at 4:26pm


Our 2019 reunion in Boise Idaho was a success.


We now have new friends to share our reunion with. The shipmates of USS Finch were friendly and hospitable to say the least.

We also visited the old State Penitentiary, Birds of Prey & the War Hawk museum. If you can, please check our website or our Facebook page for the pictures.



The Navy Turns 244

October 13 marks the birthday of the U.S. Navy, which traces its roots back to the early days of the American Revolution. On October 13, 1775, the Continental Congress established a naval force, hoping that a small fleet of privateers could attack British commerce and offset British sea power. The Navy Turns 244

490 ships

The **United States Navy** has approximately 490 **ships** in both **active** service and the reserve fleet, with approximately 90 more in either the planning and ordering stages or under construction, according to the **Naval Vessel** Register and published reports.

7 Things You May Not Know About the U.S. Navy

- 1. George Washington was the father of the Navy.
- 2. The Navy was disbanded following the Revolutionary War.
- 3. The Navy was brought back largely to fight pirates
- 4. The Navy was outnumbered about 40 to 1 in the War of 1812
- 5. The Navy (haphazardly) fought the slave trade even as slavery continued.
- 6. The Navy produced six future presidents during World War II
- 7. The Navy won history's largest maritime battle.

As of this year, there are currently 328,186 active duty members in the U.S. Navy. Of that number, there are 54,713 officers, 268,987 enlisted members, and 4,486 midshipmen. That's a lot of bravery!

Did you know that the term "Field Day" comes from the early 1800s when military men would attend parades in their honor?

"Anchor's Aweigh" was written by Lt. Charles Zimmerman, who was the Musical Director of the Naval Academy in 1906. Naval students and Navy members alike still proudly sing the anthem today.
