# The History Of Navy Day

Navy Day is a holiday that was created in 1922 by the Navy League of the United States. They choose October 27th for the date of this holiday because it was the birthday of U.S President Theodore Roosevelt, and Roosevelt was a former assistant Secretary of the Navy and was a key advocate for the expansion of the Navy. Although the first year of this holiday received a tepid reception, the following year fifty major U.S cities participated in the event, and the U.S Navy sent a number of its ships to the ports in some of these cities.

The second secretary of the U.S Department of Defense directed that the U.S Navy's participation occur on Armed Forces Day instead of Navy Day, but since the Navy League Of The United States was a civilian organization, it continued to celebrate the day as before. Therefore, the last time the U.S military celebrated Navy Day officially was in 1949.

During the 1970s, historical research discovered that the Navy's birthday was actually on October 13, 1775. This is when the Continental Navy was first established during the American Revolution. As a result, Chief of Naval Operations Admiral Elmo R. Zumwalt worked to define the 13th October as Navy Day. However, what actually happened was that the Navy's Birthday was established on October 13 and Navy Day continued to be celebrated by civilians on October 27.

# Facts About The U.S Navy

- The Continental Navy was formed in 1775 but disbanded in 1785.
- The U.S went without a navy until it was reestablished under the Naval Act of 1794.
- Six U.S Presidents have served in the United States Navy since World War II.
- . The U.S Navy has over 323,000+ active members—making it the largest navy in the world.
- The U.S Navy has over 288 battle force ships, 3,700 aircraft, 17 frigates, and 72 subs.
- The U.S Navy operates in every major body of water around the entire world.

The 30 year ship building plan released by the Navy in 2020 has the service reaching a fleet of 355 ships by 2049. It expects to build it's active ship total to 305 by end of 2021.

The Navy owns 11 of the worlds 43 active Aircraft Carriers and that doesn't count it's nearly 2 dozen flat decked amphibious ships that might well be considered carriers in their right. This is, as of June 23, 2021 according to data compiled and updated by the Navy, is the currant total of battle force ships:

We have 296 total Battle force active ships in commission.

The Navy will commission 7 ships in 2021 and christen another 8 according to data provided by Naval Sea Systems Command.

The guided missile destroyer fleet will welcome DDG-118 Daniel Inouyl, named after the late US Senator from Hawaii. While the littoral combat ship Oakland, Minneapolis, St Paul and Mobile are expected to join LCS community.

The expeditionary mobile base, Miguel Keith, will be commissioned named in honor of late Marine Corps Lance Corporal who received a posthumously Medal of Honor for heroism during the Vietnam war under the sea.

The fast attack submarine Oregon and Montana will also enter the fleet according to NAVSEA.

The US Navy has announced it intends to mothball the first four littoral combat ships by March 2021, with the youngest spending just six years in active service.

Freedom, Independence, Fort Worth and Coronado would be mothballed along with five other US Navy ships, according to a June 20 message from the chief of naval operations, which was first reported by Defense News.

The oldest among them, USS Freedom, entered service in 2008. The ships are to be put in OCIR (Out of Commission, In Reserve), the status of a decommissioned ship being held in reserve for potential future mobilization.

The other five ships, Cyclone-class coastal patrol ship USS Zephyr, USS Shamal and USS Cyclone, along with fleet tug USNS Sioux and dock landing ship USS Fort McHenry will be dismantled.

The navy first announced its plans on the decommissioning of the LCS in its fiscal year 2021 budget request.

"Those four test ships were instrumental to wringing out the crewing, the maintenance and all the other things we needed to learn from them," Navy Rear Admiral Randy Crites, the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Navy for Budget, told reporters during a press briefing in February this year. "But they're not configured like the other LCS in the fleet, and they need significant upgrades. Everything from combat systems, to structural, you name it."

The LCS program is split into two classes, the monohull Freedom variant and the aluminium trimaran Independence variant. The program envisioned the ships as being capable of conducting mine countermeasures, anti-submarine and surface warfare missions by embarking different mission modules. The navy is years behind schedule on testing and certifying the mission module packages.

During the most recent seven-month deployment, John S. McCain participated in the annual multinational exercise MALABAR alongside the Indian Navy, Japan Maritime Self-Defense Force, and Royal Australian Navy, focusing on anti-submarine and anti-surface operations.

In March, 2011, John S. McCain responded in support of Operation Tomodachi to provide humanitarian assistance following the Tohoku earthquake and tsunami.

"It is definitely a changing of the guard with USS John S. McCain and her crew departing the 7th Fleet after over 24 years in Japan," said Capt. Chase Sargeant, Commander, Task Force 71/Destroyer Squadron 15. "The contributions of the current and all previous crews in defending peace and stability in the Indo-Pacific cannot be overstated, and the entire forward-deployed fleet wishes John S. McCain fair winds as she transfers to her new homeport of Everett, Washington."

John S. McCain is scheduled to join US 3rd Fleet, which leads naval forces in the Indo-Pacific and provides the realistic, relevant training necessary for an effective global Navy. US 3rd Fleet works consistently with US 7th Fleet to complement one another and provide commanders capable, ready assets across the spectrum of military operations in the Indo-Pacific.

JSS John McCain (DDG 56) is the latest US Navy ship to depart its Japan homeport after years of forward-deployed operations.

DDG 56 left Yokosuka, Japan, Sept. 17, as part of a scheduled homeport shift to Naval Station Everett, Vashington.

While forward-deployed to Fleet Activities Yokosuka, John S. McCain has operated independently and with carrier strike groups in the region since arriving to US 7th Fleet in the summer of 1997.

While the ship supported a range of operations and evolutions, it is perhaps most widely known for the atal 2017 incident, when it collided with the Alnic MC commercial tanker on August 21 off the coast of Singapore. Ten US Navy sailors lost their lives in the collision and another five were injured. It took the vavy over two years to return the ship to sea.

John S. McCain and her sailors have proven time and time again our Navy's resolve to answer the call in upport of our nation and our allies," said Cmdr. Tin Tran, USS John S McCain's commanding officer. After 24 years of faithful overseas service, we are ready to head back home to America, back to Vashington State. Our Sailors will forever remember the bonds of friendship and hospitality Japan has hown us."

During 24 years of forward-deployed service, John S. McCain operated across the region from the Indian Docan to the Sea of Japan supporting joint and multinational exercises and operations to strengthen US Illiances and partnerships, maritime security, and promote regional stability toward a free and open ndo-Pacific.

ohn S. McCain also participated in several surge deployments to US 5th Fleet in support of the USS ndependence battle group in 1998 and USS Kitty Hawk strike group in 2002 and again in 2003 supporting perations Enduring and Iraqi Freedom.
