
He and his wife live in Grafton, ND and have been married 46 years.

# John Walker

Mr. John Walker was born in England, moved to Montana in 1947 with his mother at age 10. He became a citizen in 1955 so he could join the Navy. John joined the Montana National Guard the day after turning 17 and two days after graduating from high school joined the Navy. From 1955 to 1959 he served on the USS Wilhoite DER 397 as a radarman. While on the Wilhoite just before Christmas 1957 and at sea some 200 miles off the coast of Washington to relieve another DER on picket station, John had got a bloody nose that the doctor was unable to stop so they packed it and put tape across his nose and he was "high-lined" transferred to the ship they were relieving. A Marine Corp veteran, at his quilt presentation, said this is not for the faint of heart! John said both ships were rocking hard in the waves, so he was bouncing all over the place but he didn't get wet. By the time John arrived at the Navel Hospital in Bremerton, Washington, his nose bleed had stopped so he spent a very dull and lonely Christmas that year. John then joined the US Air Force and was a radar controller from 1959 to 1963.



# **BEN YONKOFSKI**

Ben joined the navy in May of 1966. Following boot camp, I was assiggned to the USS Wilhoite out of Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, assigned to the deck force. I made my first tour to Viet Nam. After a year I was transferred to OC Division to become a radioman 3rd class. In another year I ws promoted to radioman 2nd class and went on my second tour to Vietnam. Upon returning from Nam, I was transferred to the USS Ingersoll. Six months later I was transferred to the USS Hornet where I took the third and final tour to Vietnam. During my time in the navy our crew received two navy unit citation awards.
